Set a Reading Goal: When choosing a reading goal for your family, remember that you know your child best! Tip: Make the goal challenging enough to create a real sense of accomplishment. Track pages, chapters, books read, or time spent—whether in minutes or hours. For reluctant readers, start simple by aiming to read every day.

Adjust as Needed: Remember, you can always adjust your goals as the summer progresses. Flexibility is key to keeping reading fun and stress-free.

Earn Tokens: Once a row is filled, bring it to the library to redeem a token for our gumball machine! Our gumball machines give out bead, so your child can create a unique summer reading necklace. Sometime, you'll receive a special prize instead of a bead!

Collect More Beads and Charms: Keep filling rows for more tokens and beads. Earn special charms by attending library programs.


